Male lions have manes that make them look extra big and impressive. Their manes get darker as they get older.



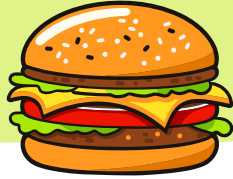
Lions are super strong.
